PROCEDURE: Application of MULTIPAD™ Non-Adherent Wound Dressing

PURPOSE: Provides absorption of drainage, and is non-adherent.

OUTCOME: Wound drainage is contained. Skin integrity is improved/maintained.

ASSESSMENT/INDICATIONS:

Used as a **primary** or **secondary** dressing over:

All Dermal Ulcers Lacerations, Cuts
Diabetic Ulcers Abrasions
Abdominal Wounds Donor Sites
Infected Wounds 2nd Degree Burns
Superficial Wounds

PLANNING/MATERIALS NEEDED:

- 1. Saline, Ringer's, or a balanced salt solution for non-toxic cleansing.
- 2. MULTIPAD to dress wound.
- 3. Stretch-Net® Tubular Elastic Bandage, tape, or roll gauze to secure MULTIPAD.

IMPLEMENTATION/PROCEDURE:

- 1. Cleanse/irrigate wound with the non-toxic solution.
- 2. Position MULTIPAD over wound.

Note: If using as a secondary dressing, first apply the primary dressing /filler, i.e.MULTIDEX® to the wound.

- 3. Secure with Stretch-Net, tape, or roll gauze.
- 4. To remove: Gently lift dressing from wound. Clean and redress wound.
- 5. Dispose of soiled dressing per institution's policy.

EVALUATION:

Drainage is contained; skin integrity is maintained or improved.

NOTE: Local wound care cannot overcome the deficits of unrelieved malnutrition, pressure, or trauma, or compromised blood flow. Interventions must be instituted to reduce/relieve these factors that contribute to impaired wound healing in order to achieve the optimum outcome.
