Saturate


> Saturate a cotton swab or gauze with Detachol.





Apply

> Apply Detachol, beginning at the edge of the tape or device.





Remove

Once the corner is permeated, gently lift up, continuing to apply Detachol while gently lifting the tape or device until the adhesive is completely removed.





Cleanse

> Wash the area with soap and water or skin cleanser.
