How to use an incontinence clamp

- Periodically check the clamp for any signs of wear or damage and replace it if you notice any issues.

Urinating with your clamp

One of the common concerns with penile clamps is the ability to urinate while wearing them. Using a penile clamp does not eliminate the need to urinate so you will have to go to the toilet regularly. Please follow these steps for a hassle-free experience:

- **Unlock the clamp**: Before urinating, release the clamp to allow the free flow of urine.
- Reapply after urination: After urinating, lock the clamp again following the steps mentioned



Cleaning your clamp

Maintaining proper hygiene with the penile clamp is essential to prevent infections and skin irritation. Simply follow these instructions to clean your clamp:

- Clean the clamp regularly using mild soap and water. You can also remove the stabilizer pads for a thorough cleaning.
- **Ensure it is completely dry before using it again**. Lunderg clamps are made with an ABS frame and medical-grade silicone pads, so they can be dried quickly using a towel.
- Avoid using a washing machine or harsh chemicals like bleach, as they may damage the material of the clamp.
- Store the clamp in a clean, dry place when not in use.
